

Pastor's Message

As we enter into our season of Sacrificial Giving, we hear in the Gospel of Luke Jesus' teaching that our God is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. "He is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive."

That very insight, that all are alive in the plan of God, is at the heart of Christian Stewardship. We believe that all that we are (the gift of life itself) and all that we have (family, friends, work, income) is a gift from God.

These gifts are not ours for the keeping. Ultimately, we must

surrender them all at the moment of death. Rather, they are to be received with gratitude and returned to God through our work of discipleship with increase.

It is that Stewardship action that brings life and vitality to the Body of Christ, and purpose and truth to each of our lives. As a Stewardship parish we have seen firsthand how our "Blessings Count" – our 2020 Sacrificial Giving theme.

In this, our 60th anniversary year, the Year of Witness, we are more connected to the charitable works of the larger community (The Sharing Center, Hope CommUnity Center, Pathways to Care, Catholic Charities of Central Florida, Habitat for Humanity, Feeding Children Everywhere, Peace Orphanage in Mexico, the list goes on) than ever before. Our excellent school and faith formation programs (R.C.I.A., Quest, Small Faith Sharing Groups) are thriving as are our prayer opportunities – none stronger than our experience of Sunday worship!

I know you have felt the blessings that have been gifted to our parish community. That is why you and your family are here. And the uniquely wonderful thing about these Christian blessings is just this: the more we share them – the more we give them away – the more we feel the return of them in our own lives. Blessings

GIVING OF TIME, TALENT & TREASURE

What identifies a steward? Safeguarding material and human resources and using them responsibly are one answer; so is the generous giving of time, talent, and treasure.



et us begin with being a disciple— a follower of our Lord Jesus Christ. As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples.

Jesus' disciples, and Christian stewards, recognize God as the origin of life and source of all things. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and use them to show our love for God and for one another. We look to the life and teaching of Jesus for guidance in living as Christian stewards.

Sacrificial Giving begins with the recognition that everything we have has been given to us by God...our time, our talents, our money, even life itself. Sacrificial Giving is based on an understanding that as Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly. share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord.

PLANNED

The decision to give is just that – a decision. It requires thought and time, so that it is integrated with other financial decisions as part of a careful, intentional response to God's generosity.

A PRIORITY

Part of our planning ensures that we give the "first fruits" – gifts given first and not after other obligations have been satisfied. Our giving should be proportionate or commensurate to what God has given us. Most people use the biblical concept of the tithe, a tenth, as a guide.

SACRIFICIAL

Our gift becomes sacrificial when it comes from our substance rather than our abundance. When we give out of our substance, we are changed in the process. We have given away something we thought we needed for ourselves, thus changing our lifestyle. We have acted on our belief that our security lies not in our material resources but in God.

AN EXPRESSION OF GRATITUDE

If we truly believe that God gives us all that we have, gratitude is our first response. The Christian Steward dedicates a portion of these God-given gifts – our time, talent, and treasure – to furthering God's Kingdom.





TAKE A STEP

In prayerful thanksgiving for the many blessings received from God.

Prayerfully consider setting a Sacrificial Giving goal. Most people use the biblical concept of the tithe of 10%. It may take a few years to get there, but this is a worthy and rewarding goal for all on the road of discipleship.

You are asked to give an equal percentage to other charities (for example: if you're giving 5% to the parish in the regular Sunday envelope, please give an additional 5% to other charities for 10% total giving). Other charities might include Food Pantries and other programs for the Poor, Missions, Catholic Education donations, the Diocese, vocations or Parish Maintenance.

ESTIMATE YOUR SACRIFICIAL GIVING COMMITMENT

- Find your household income at the left of the chart.*
- Move across on the same line to find the amount you currently give weekly.
- Move straight up the chart to find what percentage of your income your current giving represents.
- Please consider taking a step by pledging up a level. For example: if you presently give 2% to the parish, consider pledging 2.5% or 3% now.

Encourage 1,500 families to plan and prioritize their giving by completing the commitment card.

Encourage families to sacrificially give \$3,000,000 for regular Sunday & Holy Day offerings during the next year, 2020.
